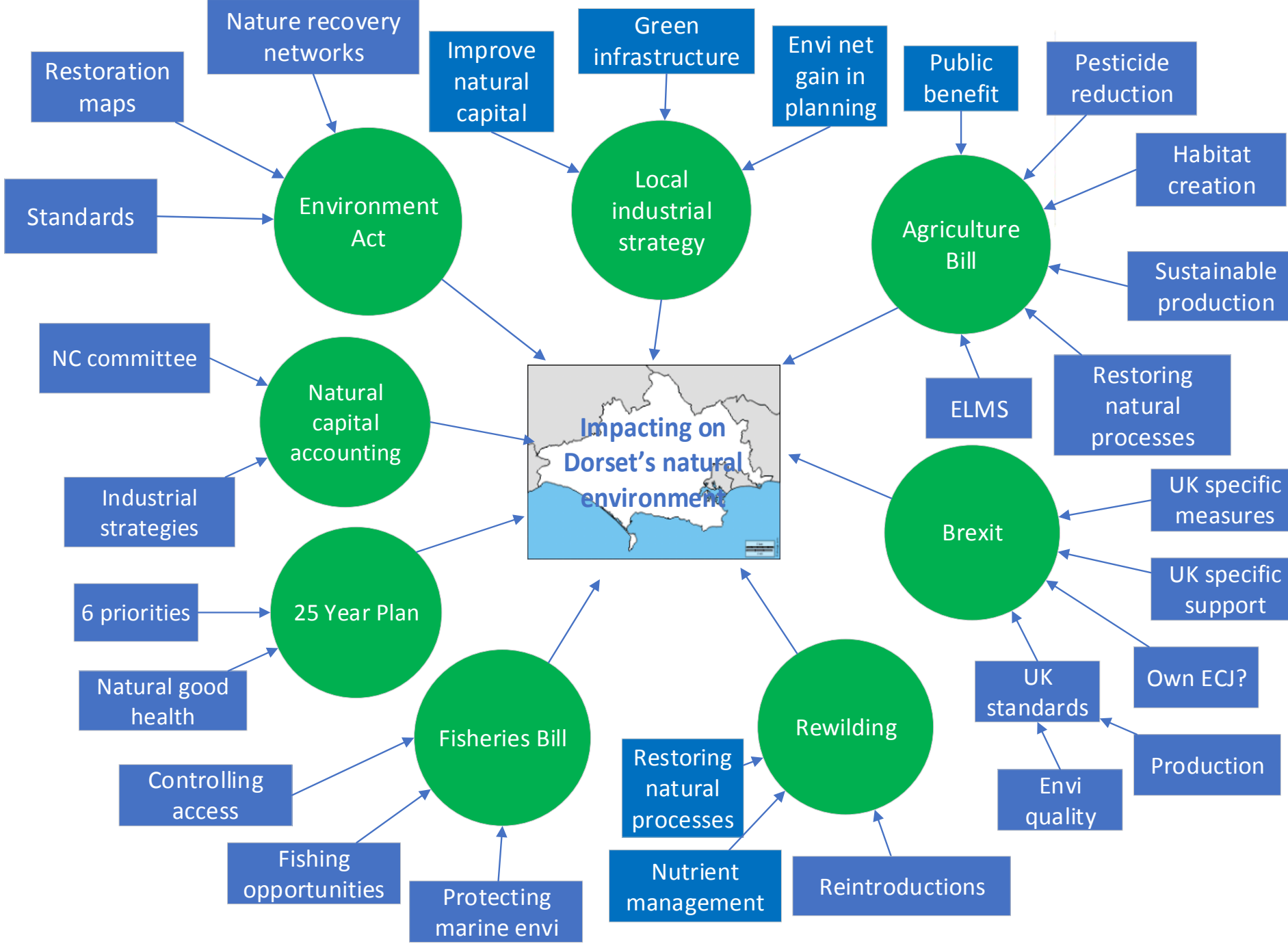
A changing world

Our vision for Dorset

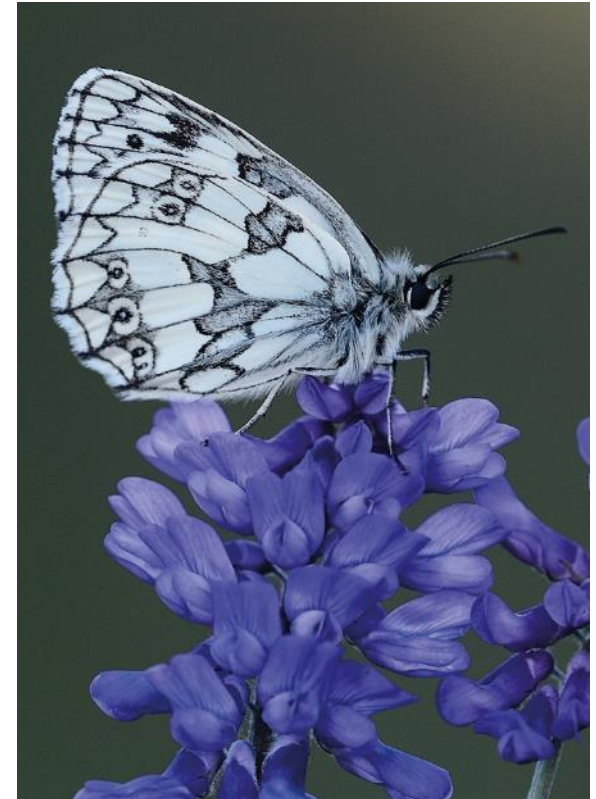


This year we will produce a vision / a manifesto / a plan for what we want to see happen to Dorset's environment.
